

## GRADING SCALE IN MOLDOVA

Evaluation results of students' learning activities shall be evaluated with grades from 1 to 10, generally with no decimals. Grades from "5" to "10", obtained in result of course unit/ module evaluation allow attainment of credits allocated to them, according to curriculum plan. Final grade results from the weighted sum of grades from current evaluations and final examination, being rounded up to the benefit of student. Student who received a grade lower than „5” shall not be admitted to final examination.

**Grade 10** or „**excellent**” (ECTS equivalent – **A**) is given for profound and remarkable demonstration of theoretical and practical competencies developed within course unit/ module, creativity and dexterities in application of acquired skills, considerable independent work and versed knowledge of literature in the respective domain. Student assimilated 91 – 100% of material included in the curriculum/ syllabus of course unit/ module.

**Grade 9** or „**very good**” (ECTS equivalent– **B**) is given for a very good demonstration of theoretical and practical competencies developed within course unit/ module, very good dexterities in application of acquired skills with some minor/ nonessential errors. Student assimilated 81 – 90% of material included in the curriculum (syllabus) of course unit/ module.

**Grade 8** or „**good**” (ECTS equivalent – **C**) is given for good demonstration of theoretical and practical competencies developed within course unit/ module, good dexterities in application of study finalities with a certain lack of trust and imprecision in regard to the depth and details of course unit/ module, but which student can correct through additional questions. Student assimilated 71 – 80% of material included in the curriculum (syllabus) of course unit/ module.

**Grades 6 and 7** or „**satisfactory**” (ECTS equivalent – **D**) are given for demonstration of basic skills developed within course unit/ module and ability to apply them in typical situations. Student's answer lacks confidence and significant gaps are stated in the knowledge of course unit/ module. Students assimilated 61 – 65% and respectively 66 – 70% of material.

**Grades 5** or „**poor**” (ECTS equivalent - **E**) is given for demonstration of minimum competencies from the domain of course unit/ module, accomplishment of which encounters many difficulties. Student assimilated 51 – 60% of material.

**Grades 3 and 4 (ECTS equivalent– FX)** are given when student fails to demonstrate minimum competencies and for promotion of course unit, additional work is required. Student assimilated 31 – 40% and respectively 41 – 50% of material.

**Grades 1 and 2 or „unsatisfactory” (ECTE equivalent– F)** are given to the student who copied or demonstrated a minimal knowledge of material 0 – 30%. In this case, for promotion of course unit, student is still required a lot of work.

- In case of nongradual evaluation, course unit/ module shall be considered completed, if student demonstrates possession of skills envisaged through curriculum of course unit/ module. Students may receive the following qualifiers:
  - a) „accepted” – given to student who demonstrated that necessary competences, skills and knowledge were acquired;
  - b) „rejected” – given to student who didn't accumulate necessary competences, skills and knowledge in accordance with syllabus.
  
- A course unit/ module has only one final grade.
  
- Evaluation result of annual thesis/ project shall be taken into consideration, in the established proportion, for determining grade of the respective course unit/ module. Obtaining credits for the respective course unit/ module is conditioned by execution and defense of annual thesis/ project.
  
- Grade given by examiner may be contested in accordance with provisions of regulation. Appeals shall be examined by the third party appointed by dean of faculty together with head of the respective department, according to procedure established by Senate of education institution.
